The meeting was opened at 19:58

1. To consider accepting apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Cllr. Philip Dingle who was away on holiday and Cllr. Ed Connolly who was attending another meeting.

2. To record declarations of interest from members in any items on the agenda

There were no declarations of interest.

3. To approve the minutes of the last Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 3 March 2025

The minutes had been circulated to all councillors prior to the meeting. Cllr. Harrison proposed they be accepted, Cllr. Swaddling seconded the proposal and councillors voted with a show of hands. The minutes were duly signed by the Chair, Cllr. Philip Leslie.

4. To discuss any matters arising from the minutes (3 March 2025) not on the agenda.

There were no matters arising.

5. To adjourn the meeting for public participation, an opportunity for members of the public to raise any queries and concerns.

Cllr. Leslie thanked everybody for attending and the meeting was adjourned at 20:01.

Rocklands Parish website. Mention was made that the choice of text colour on the website made it difficult to read against the similar background colour. The website is currently being worked on by Ian Scholes and he is aware of the difficulty with the colours and will be working to change this. Cllr. Leslie thanked Ian for the work he is doing on the website. There is a legal responsibility for the website to conform to various standards and Ian and Cllr. Leslie are currently looking at requirements and receiving quotations from government backed organisations. Actively looking at obligations. Could cost ~£300 for set up and then maintenance thereafter.

Village Hall ditch. Dave Jones thanked those involved in sorting issues with the Village Hall ditch. Cllr. Leslie for identifying practical solutions to the issues, Cllr. Buckland for communicating with Anglian Water and Cllr. Harrison for convening the necessary meetings at the Village Hall. All efforts are much appreciated.

Cllr. Buckland explained the **stones** remaining were to be used in gabions. They are here temporarily and will be moved if it is decided not to use them. Sand-bags cemented in place might be better. It is noted a pipe into the ditch is off-centre. Re-alignment of the pipe could provide a quick fix.

Rocklander. Thank you to Karen Roseberry for producing the monthly Rocklander single-handedly.

Rocklands play area. A resident from Kemp Meadow attended the meeting to complain about the noise, children made when they play in the play area and on the zip wire. They also mentioned foul language coming from the children, a squeaky swing and being able to see into their garden and house from the play area. Cllr. Leslie explained the space is a public area and has been there for many years. Use of the area cannot be policed and any noise is not considered a nuisance before 11pm. There is nothing the PC

can do. They can't enforce curfews or monitor behaviour but they could mention to the Norfolk Constabulary Beat Manager at Attleborough.

Post meeting note: At a later date, the police were called to attend when the behaviour of the residents in the house adjoining became unacceptable and upsetting to the children and parents present. Thank you to Cllr. Buckland for managing the situation in a professional manner. The police have spoken to the residents in Kemp Meadow and reinforced that the area is a playground and can be used up to 11pm. They hoped there would be no further issues.

The meeting resumed at 20:15

6. Speeding: To update on SID (flashing speed sign) (RH)

Cllr. Harrison had circulated his report to all councillors prior to this meeting.

In the last period, the speed sign was deployed as follows:

a) The Street - Vehicles Approaching Crossroads

Deployed: 10:00 hrs 13 February 2025

Finished: 11:00 hrs 20 March 2025 (*stopped recording on 11 March*)

The analysis results show:

9,624 vehicles detected

Average 370 vehicles/day

Morning peak time - 08:00 to 09:00

Afternoon peak time - 15:15 to 16:15

7,532 vehicles (78.3%) within **30 mph** speed limit

2,092 vehicles (21.7%) exceeding speed limit

- of which 363 vehicles (3.8%) over 35 mph - and likely open to a fine*

Top speed: **50 mph** - 13/02/2025

Since the last deployment monitoring traffic approaching the crossroads from the Village:

- vehicle movements averaged 370 per day - a 3.4% decrease in daily traffic volumes.
- vehicles speeding numbered 2,092 (21.7%) - a 0.9% increase in the proportion of vehicles speeding.
- vehicles open to enforcement action numbered 363 (3.8%) - a 0.2% increase in vehicles open to enforcement.

Note that 6 vehicles were recorded travelling at 50 mph during this period.

b) Attleborough Road (B1077) - Vehicles from Great Ellingham

Deployed: 11:00 hrs 20 March 2025

Finished: 07:00 hrs 20 April 2025 (*stopped recording on 07:00 20 April*)

The analysis results show:

49,160 vehicles detected

Average 1,172 vehicles/day

Morning peak time - 06:30 to 07:30

Afternoon peak time - 15:30 to 16:30

36,993 vehicles (75.3%) within **40 mph** speed limit

12,167 vehicles (24.7%) exceeding speed limit

- of which 4,116 vehicles (8.4%) over 45 mph - and likely open to a fine*

Top speed: **75 mph** - 29/03/2025

Since the last deployment monitoring traffic approaching from Great Ellingham:

- vehicle movements averaged 1,172 per day - a significant 23.6% decrease in daily traffic volumes.
- vehicles speeding numbered 12,167 (24.7%) - an 8.3% increase in the proportion of vehicles speeding.
- vehicles open to enforcement action numbered 4,116 (8.4%) - a 3.6% increase in vehicles open to enforcement.

Note that 4 vehicles were recorded travelling at 75 mph during this period. It is of great concern that, with a 23.6% decrease in traffic volumes, we recorded significant increases in proportions of vehicles speeding and open to enforcement.

I have sent a copy of our latest speed monitoring spreadsheets to our area Beat Manager at Attleborough Police.

Cllr Tim Ford and I moved the speed sign to monitor traffic on Attleborough Road (B1077) approaching from Caston, on 20 April.

As always, I am indebted to Tim for his continued support.

Cllr. Swaddling confirmed the 40mph speed limits had been repainted by Highways at Brayes Lane. Really need the other side done too.

7. To update on Flooding and Rockland's Flood Group.(RH)

Cllr. Harrison had circulated his report to all councillors prior to this meeting.

On Monday 14 April, Steve Halls (Senior Flood Risk Officer – Technical Lead, Water Management Team, NCC) and a colleague met with representatives of the Parish Council, Flood Group and Village Hall Committee in Rocklands.

Strengthening of the sides of the Village Hall ditch was first discussed. Rather than gabions, we were advised to extend the cement-filled bags further down the sides of the ditch. This proposal has been put to our area Highways Engineer, who assisted with this previously.

Several hours were then spent looking at various areas of the village in which Natural Flood Mitigation (NFM) could be potentially employed to hold-back surface water flows to significantly reduce volumes impacting on houses, The Street and Mill Lane. The NCC Water Management Team (Lead Local Flood Authority) have detailed LIDAR (Light Detection and Ranging – using laser scanning) 3D terrain maps of the surface water catchment area which impacts on the village. Generally, the most significant surface water flows originate from the Little Ellingham area – which is at higher ground level – and travel towards the village through/across the land in between.

A few primary locations (which would offer the greatest benefit) were identified – where attenuation ditches and ponds could be established. Landowners would benefit from grants to establish such features, and ongoing funding to cover maintenance.

As advised, we are currently waiting for a report from the LLFA before setting-up meetings with a couple of key landowners to investigate possibilities.

Such NFM works have great potential to prevent significant high flows of water into The Street and Mill Lane.

8. To update on Green Lane and Green Lane Working Group (AJB/PL)

Green Lane is a challenge. Cllr. Leslie has commissioned a full legal position on Green Lane before the project group starts. The solicitor requires a few more checks from NCC. Have waited 9 weeks.

The group will be renamed, **The Rocklands Community Project Group**.

9. To report on Financial Matters

9.1 Approval of accounts 2024/2025 (AGAR Form 2, PKF Littlejohn, External auditors.)

The end of the financial year was 31 March. The Clerk had prepared the end of year accounts and completed the annual return (AGAR) for the external auditor (PKF Littlejohn). The AGAR (Form 2) had been circulated to the councillors prior to the meeting for reference.

9.1.1 Certificate of Exemption from limited assurance review (p3) (<£25,000 gross income)

The Clerk explained that because both gross income and expenditure were less than £25,000, Rocklands Parish Council was eligible to apply for an exemption certificate for the year 2024/2025 meaning a limited assurance review would not be carried out by the external auditors. There would therefore be no fee charged this year which is good news. The Certificate of Exemption was approved by the councillors and signed by the chair Cllr. Leslie and the Clerk. The Clerk would send the completed/signed form (p3) to PKF Littlejohn the external auditors.

9.1.2 Annual Internal auditor's report (p4)

Michaela Canham had carried out the internal audit of the accounts for Rocklands again this year and confirmed all accounts are in order (p4). Michaela's invoice received for £35.

12. To update on the Breckland Local Plan (RH)

Cllr. Harrison had circulated his report to all councillors prior to this meeting.

Following my last report - where Breckland had suspended work on the new Local Plan - the following is a summary on where we currently are:

The Local Plan determines the growth and development in the district for the next 25 years. It helps to ensure that planning decisions are made in the best interests of the communities. Local Authorities are required to review their Local Plan every 5 years.

Breckland's current Local Plan was adopted in November 2019, and the current review began in March 2023 with an initial survey. This was followed in January-February 2024 by a consultation on 'Development Strategy' - and then a further consultation in May-July 2024 on 'Preferred Options', for feedback on a full draft of the new Local Plan.

In September 2024, Breckland paused work on the new Local Plan due to the change of Government - which has imposed an increase of approx. 38% in Breckland's housing requirement.

At a special Cabinet meeting on 3 March 2025, Breckland Council agreed a revised timetable for the Local Plan Update:

- Oct-Dec 2025 - another (revised) consultation on 'Preferred Options'.
- Jul 2026-Sep 2026 - consultation on the 'Pre- submission Draft' of the new Local Plan.
- Dec 2026 - submission of the New Local Plan to the Secretary of State for examination.
- 2027 (TBA) - Examination by the Secretary of State and requested modifications.
(part of the examination will include a public meeting - chaired by the appointed Inspector)
- 2027 (TBC) - Adoption of the new Local Plan by Breckland Council.

This process will roll the new Local Plan forward to cover the period to 2046.

As before, Rocklands Parish Council will fully engage with the consultation process - holding further public meetings in the Village Hall as necessary.

Breckland have informed us that they will no longer be using the 'Commonplace' website to host news, updates and documents on the Local Plan process. Instead, they urge residents to register individually for news and updates here:

I have posted this on the Rocklands Community Hub Facebook page and requested that a copy be posted on the Rocklands website.

As part of the repeat of the 'Preferred Sites' consultation, Breckland issued another 'Call for Sites' exercise - which finished on 28 April. We have not yet had sight of the results of this exercise, but Cllr. Ford and myself will be attending a 'Parish Council Round Table' meeting at Breckland's offices in Dereham on 20 May - where Breckland intend to update us on progress on the new Local Plan, and where we will have, "...a chance for representatives of the Parish Council to discuss and share their views on the sites that have been put forward prior to a formal consultation."

Of course, we will be pressing for sight of any proposed development sites within Rocklands Parish well in advance of this meeting. Our representations on previously proposed sites will still be taken into account.

As you will be aware from previous reports, Norfolk and Suffolk County Councils have proposed to merge into a single Unitary Authority - with a Mayor - under an initiative from the new(ish) Government.

Following this, we understand, Breckland and a number of other district councils have put forward a counter-proposition - proposing three Unitary Authorities for Norfolk (essentially North, Mid and South Norfolk).

NCC want to hear from Town and Parish Councils - **and residents** - by 20 May. An online form is available at www.norfolk.gov.uk/lgrfeedback, and a number of meetings are being held around the county - the nearest at Queens Hall, Watton on 15 May (2:30pm - 4:30pm), and Central Hall, Wymondham on 19 May (7:00pm - 9:00pm).

There will also be an online event on Tuesday 20 May (6:30pm - 8:00pm)
